I cannot believe we are at the end of term already. I would like to thank all our staff and students for being amazing this term. As you know, our Year 11 students have been working incredibly hard over the last term as they embark on their GCSE examination journey. The students are half way through their examinations and they have taken these in their stride. Our students have signed up to over 200 revision sessions, over the May Half Term. I am also pleased to announce our students have viewed over 22,000 GCSEPod support videos to support them in their revision. Keep this up Year 11, you are nearly there!

On Wednesday, we celebrated our Year 9 AOL data and achievements. Over 60 students were treated to a cinema experience in our East Hall where they enjoyed a film with some sweet treats too. These students have achieved over and above in their progress, positive rewards and attitude to learning.

This week, we have had Katie Falkner who is the Development Officer for Lincolnshire County Cricket visit our school. Katie has been delivering cricket sessions with the aim of increasing interest in girls' cricket.
