
We have had a busy couple of weeks in Science with lots of activities to celebrate British Science Week 2024 and get our students involved in STEM. Some of our Year 7 students had special lessons on the exploration of Mars to celebrate Mars Day (4th March) where they learned about the search for life on the planet. On Thursday 14th March, 2024, we held a popular lunchtime Science Fair, where our Science Club demonstrated some of the fun experiments that they have carried out this year. These were all experiments that are unlikely to be seen in normal Science lessons and students particularly enjoying setting some of their teachers on fire with methane bubbles! There has been a poster competition and tutor time quiz based on the Science Week theme of 'Time'. We have had some brilliant entries and submitted some of the posters to the national competition. Finally, Miss Davis and Mrs Clark delivered assemblies at one of our local primary schools to students in KS1 and KS2, looking at how we measure time and how students will use this in Science lessons in the future.
