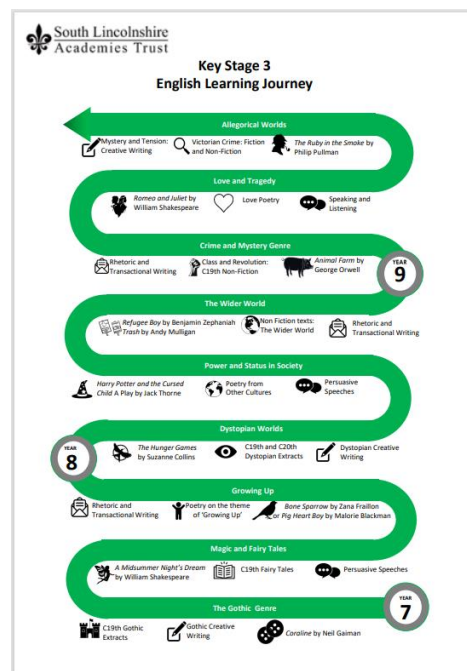

On the school website - www.spaldingacademy.org.uk/curriculum, we provide detailed information about the curriculum available for specific subjects. We are immensely proud of the outcomes our students achieve through our curriculum, including their exceptional GCSE results in the core, EBacc subjects, in the technical and vocational areas and in becoming independent, hardworking and caring young people. We believe that, without exception, our students have individual talents and abilities and are committed to providing a curriculum which is broad, rich and balanced in order to meet the needs of all.

We know that parents and carers want to know what their child is studying at school throughout the year and how the work that they are currently undertaking fits into the bigger picture for each subject area. The school website is packed with useful information on the overall curriculum and for each subject area. Curriculum information can be found under the 'Academic' section on the website. Here you will find 'Curriculum Intent' and 'Student Road Maps' for each subject area.

The Student Road Maps (example opposite) are a learning journey showing the topic areas that students will meet throughout their school life in that particular subject area. In addition to the academic subjects can also access student road maps for PSHE and Careers. The Curriculum Intent documents for each subject give more depth and may show how certain topics are linked, either by content or skills and how students progress through these skills over time. These form a useful guide to the skills and knowledge that students will be acquiring over the year.



I would like to promote our Young Carers scheme across our Trust that supports the wellbeing of all students classed under the definition as a Young Carer. A Young Carer is a person under the age of 18 who helps to look after a relative with a disability, illness, mental health condition, drug or alcohol problem. A young carer may support a parent or sibling completing additional jobs in the home or/and physical and emotional support. 
