Dear parents/carers and students,

On Wednesday evening, we held a live concert for the EVOLVE Project, which was completely SOLD OUT in advance. Students performed incredibly well with great confidence and there was an impressive selection of student bands and soloists performing a diverse range of of pop, indie and rock songs.
