Dear parents/carers and students,

It has been a fantastic week, with students fully engaged in their learning and a really positive atmosphere across the school. I would like to thank students, staff and families for their continued support.

Please could I ask parents and carers to continue supporting the school by ensuring that their child is fully equipped each day with the basic stationery requirements, including an appropriate school bag.

Our examination season has now officially begun. We have reminded all students to be calm, considerate and quiet when moving around examination rooms, which demonstrates real team spirit in supporting our Year 11 cohort.

Today marked the first written GCSE examination, and I would like to take this opportunity to wish all of our Year 11 students the very best as they continue through this important period. Their attitude towards their examinations has been outstanding, and they should be extremely proud of the commitment they have shown.

We continue to support students with revision sessions, subject crammers and Head of Department briefings ahead of exams. While this will be a busy and sometimes tiring time, students have worked incredibly hard in preparation and we are confident they will do themselves proud.

Enrichment remains a vital part of school life and an important way for students to broaden their experiences, develop confidence and build positive relationships. I have recently had the pleasure of visiting several clubs, including the Japanese Club on Tuesday lunchtime and the Games Club in the SEN Suite on Wednesdays, both of which were extremely well attended and enjoyed by students. We offer a wide variety of clubs across the week, providing opportunities for students to explore interests, develop new skills and enhance their overall school experience. A small group of Year 7 and 8 students took part in the UK Junior Maths Challenge this week. Students were required to answer a series of challenging questions designed to promote mathematical reasoning, precision of thought and fluency. We are very proud of the effort shown by all students involved and look forward to hearing whether any have achieved Bronze, Silver or Gold certificates in due course.

This is an important opportunity to meet remotely with your child's teachers to discuss progress, attendance and behaviour, as well as feedback from recent PPE examinations.
