Dear parents / carers,

In replacement for the termly newsletter, I am writing to you today on what should have been the final day of term, with Term 4 being a surreal and challenging time for us all. Understandably I have not yet received any update or information with regards to a return to school date, as it looks too early for this at this stage of the national situation that we are all living through.

However, please be reassured that I will update you the moment I am told anything about a potential return to school.

Additionally, our commitment to students will be seen in other areas and experiences that we will endeavour to not be 'forgotten', such as DoFE; the Buddies; fieldtrips; etc. We will be working in Terms 5 and 6 to make sure we can rearrange as many opportunities for our young people as possible.

As we move into what would traditionally have been the Easter break, please be reassured that the school will remain open throughout the week, with a senior member of staff in school daily to take any calls and emails off the system. We have put this measure in place to support our Key Worker families and all our families and we will always endeavour to reply to all communication promptly.

I wanted to also take the time to thank again all of our staff and parents / carers for all the support you are providing to our learners so that they can complete their daily online lessons ... you are all doing a fantastic job!

As we have already communicated, following parental feedback additional work will not be set over the Easter break, as this can be seen as valuable time for students to be able to catch up with tasks previously set so that all students can make a fresh start on work tasks from the start of Term 5 on Monday 20th April.

Finally, can I wish all families by sincere good wishes and please stay safe at this difficult time for all.
